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PreVision Partnership's "Biblical Tours-with-a-Purpose" include not only visiting the ancient sites but also understanding the spiritual condition of the people and evangelical presence today in Israel. We will be joined for certain meals and events by Israeli evangelical believers and others involved in ministry in Israel.

Sunday November 15th Day 1 - Arrival /Tel Aviv

Arrival from USA, Africa, Europe and U.K. in Tel Aviv at Ben Gurion International Airport by early afternoon. Transfer to the hotel is provided, where we will have orientation and introductions over dinner. We may take a walk after dinner or rest and relax. Dinner and overnight in Tel Aviv.

Monday November 9th Day 2 - Dead Sea - Masada - Ein Gedi – Qumran - Jericho

After an early breakfast, we follow the road south along the western shore of the Dead Sea to visit Masada, where we will ascend high upon the wilderness mountain by way of the cable car to the fortress built by King Herod. Here we survey remains of the fortifications, waterworks, synagogue, temples and palaces. We continue to Ein Gedi where David hid from King Saul. Then on to Qumran and the possible settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Finally we drive to Jericho. Dinner and overnight in Jericho.



Tuesday November 17th Day 3 - Jericho – Samaria - Beth Shean - Tiberias

We start the day visiting Jericho (Josh. 2-6; Mark 10:46; Luke 19:1) then drive to Beth Shean (1 Sam. 31:10) with possible visits to Mt. Tabor (Judges 4), Ein Harod (Judg. 7:1), and Belvoir (Crusaders Fortress). Finally we arrive at the Sea of Galilee and drive along its shores to Tiberias. Optional: Baptism in the River Jordan. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Wednesday November 18th Day 4 - Boat Ride - Sea of Galilee - Ginosar (Museum and 'Jesus Boat') - Capernaum - Mt. of Beatitudes - Tabgha - 'Hidden Waterfall'

We start the day watching a sunrise on the Sea of Galilee! A boat ride is followed by a visit to the "Jesus" Boat, that dates back to the time of Christ. Today will include visits to many biblical sites along the shore of the Sea of Galilee and in the Upper Jordan Valley: e.g. Capernaum (Matt. 4:13), Mount of Beatitudes (Matt. 5-7), Tabgha (Feeding of 5000; Mark 6), Church of St. Peter's Primacy (Luke 5; John 21), Magdala (Matt. 15:39; Luke 8:2); Gamla, Susita and view from a distance Mt. Hermon (Deut. 3:8), and Hazor (Josh. 11:10; 1 Kgs. 9:15). Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Thursday November 19th Day 5 - Cana - Nazareth - Haifa - Mt. Carmel - Caesarea

Today we travel from Galilee down to the Mediterranean shore and on to Jerusalem. Along the way we visit Cana (John 2), Nazareth (Luke 1 & 2), Megiddo (Armageddon; 1 Kgs. 9:15; Rev. 16:16), and Mt. Carmel, where Elijah prayed down the fire from Heaven and defeated the 450 prophets of Baal (1 Kgs. 18). Finally, we arrive at Caesarea; it was here that Cornelius the Centurion and his household were saved and baptized (Acts 10), and where Paul made his defense before Festus and King Agrippa prior to his final journey to Rome (Acts 25 & 26). Then we drive to Jerusalem for a restful evening. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Friday November 20th Day 6 - Mt. of Olives - Garden Tomb - Church of the Ascension - Garden of Gethsemane - Western Wall - Old City & 14 Stations of The Cross - Pool of Bethesda - St. Anne's Church

We begin our explorations of Jerusalem with a drive to the beautiful Mt. of Olives for a breathtaking panorama of the City. We will also visit the Garden Tomb for a special Communion Service. We proceed to the Church of Ascension, descend to Gethsemane with its ancient olive grove, and there visit the Church of Agony, where tradition holds that Jesus prayed. We will then walk to the holiest site in the whole Jewish world, the Western Wall (Wailing Wall) of Herod's temple. Beyond the wall lies the 35 acre temple area purchased by King David (2 Sam. 24:18-25).



On this site now stands the magnificent Dome of the Rock (the third holiest shrine in all Islam) and the El-Aksa Mosque. We also visit St. Anne's Crusader Church and the Pools of Bethesda. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Saturday November 21st Day 7 - Temple Mount - Davidson's Temple (virtual computerized tour) - City of David - Bethlehem (Church of The Nativity).

Today we continue our tour of Jerusalem as we visit the Temple Mount. We also visit Mt. Zion, The Upper Room, where Jesus spent those last momentous hours with his disciples before his passion, and where the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples on Pentecost. From there we will go to a model of Jerusalem (1 to 50 scale model of Herodian Jerusalem as it would have appeared in Jesus' time). This afternoon, we pass by Rachel's tomb on the outskirts of Bethlehem, and visit the Church of the Nativity and Shepherd's Field. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Sunday November 22nd Day 8 - Departure

Should time allow, we shall take our last walks in the streets of Jerusalem before we board our coach for the transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for return flights home to USA, Africa, Europe and U.K.
